In 2022, nearly half a million people came through our doors and experienced *The Beatles: Get Back to Let It Be*, our blockbuster exhibit. Because of this fantastic response, we are excited to keep the exhibition through 2023 to give even more fans the chance to relive the excitement of the Fab Four!

Throughout 2022 our CLE-VIP program, sponsored by Key Bank, gave free admission to Cleveland residents. We also joined a nationwide network of museums, in the Museums for All program to provide \$1 admission to anyone receiving Federal assistance through SNAP and other programs.

In keeping with our commitment to accessibility, we amped up our bilingual offerings. Now our entire website rockhall.com, all of our online classroom materials, and our Fan Vote are offered in Spanish. To keep reaching higher we partnered with Google Arts & Culture to bring an online museum experience to the world with our exhibits and stories.

We believe in equitable inclusion in all vendor and partner opportunities, which will help develop a sustainable NEO work force and contribute to a thriving local economy. As such, we participate in the Greater Cleveland Partnership's CommitCLE program and Inclusion Marketplace.

In 28 years, we've welcomed nearly
14 million visitors; engaged almost
2 million students worldwide; and
generated a cumulative economic
impact of over \$2.5 billion to our region.

Looking ahead

Rock & roll has always pushed the envelope and we are too. In 2023, we will break ground on a 50,000 square foot expansion which will give us added space for:

- Large-scale traveling exhibits
- Indoor concerts, private events, community events, and educational programs
- A student welcome center
- Lakefront accessibility

We will use these new physical improvements to elevate our ability to expand our great educational programs and live music offerings within the building, and create a beautiful lake-front park open to the entire community.

We've turned up the volume in 2023 and look forward to sharing progress on the Museum's transformational expansion.



Throughout 2022, the Rock & Roll
Hall of Fame introduced a variety
of new and exciting exhibits that
garnered the attention of fans the
world over. Alongside our permanent
and longstanding exhibits, these
temporary exhibits played a key role
in our success over the past year.

Most notably, we displayed the acclaimed *Get Back to Let It Be* exhibit. A tribute to the Beatles' immense impact on rock & roll, it was extended beyond its originally planned display period due to its popularity. The exhibit includes an immersive concert experience featuring never-before-seen recordings of their legendary rooftop concert, along with various notable artifacts.

The 2022 Inductee Exhibit, in the Donna "Rockergrrl9" Croel gallery, was another fantastic addition to the Museum this year. We were able to gather artifacts from each Inductee or their family and curate a spectacular exhibit highlighting them and some of the defining moments of their careers.

2022 offered a variety of fun programming events, including the John Mellencamp live performance and tour announcement, *Machine Gun Kelly Day*, and the *Nine Inch Nails Fan Day*. These events were highlighted by artists' visits and special exhibition installations to satisfy both diehard fans and casual visitors.

Other temporary exhibits included Bruce W. Talamon's Hotter Than July photo exhibit and the Baseline to Bassline exhibit, opened in connection with the NBA All-Star Game in Cleveland.





Onsite education programs have officially returned! In 2022, we welcomed K-12 back to the Museum. Students engaged with educators in various exhibits to make connections between music, their classroom lessons, and the world around them. Additionally, our youngest rockers are back in the building to work with music therapists on letters and kindergarten readiness through our Toddler Rock program.

Rock Hall EDU's online teacher resources continue to grow and reach learners all over the world. Thanks in part to bi-lingual Spanish and English format, we surpassed the 10,000 teacher milestone, reaching more than 1.2 million students in more than 160 countries. Our dedication to integrating our online resources with those that can participate in an onsite experience is stronger than ever. More than 2/3 of teachers who bring their students on field trips use Rock Hall EDU online materials as a pre-visit or post-visit activity. We are very excited about the upcoming site redesign; with new features and expanded searchability, it is scheduled for the 2023-2024 school year.

FIRANSIALS

2022 was another strong year for the Rock & Roll Hall of Fame. The combined success of regular operations and an on-going capital campaign has put us on steady ground following the negative impacts of the COVID-19 pandemic. We posted one of our strongest operating years since opening, netting \$2.6 million. These positive results were driven by favorable admission, retail, events, and membership, as well as through contributed revenue and continued discipline managing operating expenses. We leverage the latest industry technology to make operations more efficient while also delivering an ever-improving experience for our fans.

The Rock & Roll Hall of Fame's balance sheet continued to strengthen in 2022 due to collections for our Museum 2.0 Capital Campaign and positive operating results. The campaign dollars are held within a separate fund from operating and endowment funds. Favorable results on the balance sheet were partially offset by unfavorable investment activity associated with external market factors impacting our investment portfolio. Investment losses are unrealized, and we expect to recover losses as the market rebounds. In sum, the Rock & Roll Hall of Fame's net assets grew by \$8.7 million during 2022.
